It is also more than fairness and equality; it is a strong bias towards the weak, the poor and the socially disadvantaged.

Justice builds a community where everyone’s well-being is bound up with that of everyone else. Without true Justice there cannot be true peace.

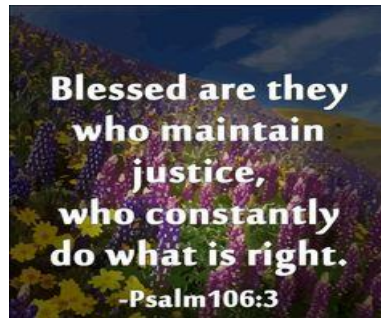
